

## National Dachshund Show weekend: 25 – 28 May 2023

The first event of the 4 day long weekend in May is our Championship show to be held on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> May commencing at 4pm. The judge will be Mr Calin Simu, a Dachshund specialist from Romania who has owned and bred many wire haired dachshunds in the past.

The Sweepstakes show is on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> May commencing at 10.30am and will be judged by well known Dachshund specialist, Mr Dan Harrison of Boondox Dachshunds, USA. Dan has been involved in both Long Haired Dachshunds and Smooth Haired Dachshunds for many years and has a wealth of knowledge to share. So much so, that we are in process of asking Dan whether he



is available to hold an educational seminar on the evening of Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> May in the Function Room at Durack. The plan is to open this up to all National show exhibitors and attendees plus judges and aspiring judges, free of charge, as it's a great opportunity to learn from someone with so much knowledge about our breed. More details on this event will follow once confirmed and finalized.

The National Dachshund show itself will be held over 2 days, namely Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> May, judged by Mrs Dawn Norton from the UK, a well know breeder of Mini Longs for many years. Saturday will be devoted to the judging of Longs, Mini Longs and Rabbit longs, Wires, Mini Wires and Rabbit Wires, with Sunday being the day for Smooths, Mini Smooths and Rabbit Smooths. Dawn is very much looking forward to her Australia visit and we will be making sure to show her some of the sights and attractions of Brisbane, once the business of showing has been completed.

An after-show dinner will be held on the evening of Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> May to conclude the weekend. Our information brochure has been distributed and is available on our website under the "Shows" tab. This booklet is being updated regularly as more details come to hand, so we suggest that you keep tabs on the booklet via our website. The latest version has a resume from all 3 judges included so that you can familiarize yourself with their "pedigrees".

Many of the camp sites at Durack have already been booked. If you are hoping to book a campsite at Durack and are having difficulties, please get hold of a committee member who will endeavour to



help. Alternative accommodation options are also listed in the information booklet.

A National Dachshund Council Handbook will be available on the weekend to those people who have ordered one and/or contributed to the Handbook. 

powerpoint presentation of the Champions for us all to see.









#### **Fuel Raffle**
