Royal Brisbane Show - August 2023

This year there were 2 shows at the Ekka where Dachshunds were judged by specialist Dachshund judge Ms Elisabeth Rhodin (Sweden) in Show 1 and by Mr Mark Anderson (South Africa) in Show 2.

It was noisy, particularly with the fun fair and entertainment areas immediately adjacent to the judging rings. With a specific ring allocated just for dachshunds, it meant each of the 3 rings were substantially smaller than in previous years. It is however a great opportunity to showcase pedigree dogs to the general public and a large enthusiastic crowd, gathered ringside to interact with the dogs and chat to exhibitors.

AUGUST CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

On the 13th August 2023, just prior to the Ekka show in Brisbane, our club held a second Championship show of the year, with specialist Dachshund judge Miss Jill Rhodin of Sweden officiating. Jill and her mother Elisabeth, are breeders of Long Haired dachshunds in Sweden under the Ornbergets prefix.

A total of 92 dogs were entered at this show and the club's thanks go to Ainslie Carius for doing such a great job as both Show Manager and Steward, on the day.

Everyone thoroughly enjoyed showing under Jill and the general feedback was that she had a lovely gentle way with the dogs and especially with the puppies, which was most appreciated.

Jill herself enjoyed the appointment and gave her feedback as follows:

"I was very honored to be invited to judge at the Dachshund Club of Queensland Inc. Specialty Championship Show on the 13th August 2023. With a very nice entry I was spoiled with plenty to choose from when picking my winners. The lovely weather, the great location, the perfect ring steward and her gorgeous little helper, the very professional and friendly exhibitors and the beautiful dogs for sure made my day the most enjoyable!

The overall quality was very good and especially miniature smooths stood out in quality and numbers. I found many beautiful winners in this variety and the type was very consistent. I was however a little disappointed of the mentality over all in this variety as I missed to see the characteristic energetic, happy and playful little dog that for me is the typical dachshund. In standard smooths I found many dogs that was a bit overdone in type to be as functional, agile and active as a dachshunds should be.

In wires the quality was the most inconsistent. I however found some very nice constructed dogs in the end but very few with the really harsh wire coat all over the body that is so important for them to be called wires.

In longs the standard variety stood out in quality, however there were not many of them. I found my final winner of the day in this variety and this dog had that super combination of construction and showmanship which for me makes that final decision to give him the Blue ribbon rather easy!

I have decided to share my critiques on my main winners and they are written in the European way of both writing positive and negative things about the dogs which for me is a way of better describing the dog. I hope you appreciate it!

Thanks again for showing your beautiful dogs under me and I hope I will be able to see you in the ring somewhere again on the future."

All dogs and puppies can benefit from socialising and learning basic lead training.

At the recent Festive Fun Day, Leisa had a group of volunteers attend to demonstrate what they have learned at show training classes and to encourage other people to come along and join in. This was well received and hopefully some more newbies will soon be attending training. At only \$5 per handler it is certainly the most affordable training class out there and has proven to be a steady source of revenue for our club.

SCENTING TRIALS by Julie Hamilton

We have been doing scenting with our three Standard Smooth dachshunds, Quinnie, Dellie and Georgia, for about 3 and a half years and they absolutely love it. It comes naturally to dachshunds, as being scent hounds, this is what they were originally bred for. It is something that you can practice at home, with very little expenditure, once your dogs are on Odour. The odours that the dogs search for are Birch, Anise, Clove and Cyprus (oil on Q tips).

To keep it challenging for both the handler and dog, there are competitions that you can enter, beginning from Novice up to Advanced until your dog qualifies as a Scenting Champion.





In competition there are four elements: containers, interiors, exteriors and vehicles. You and your dog have a set time assigned by the judge for your dog to find the Odour and indicate to the handler who then calls "alert" and the judge lets you know if you are right.

There are two associations that run the scenting competitions —ANKC and ACSW (Australian Canine Scent Work).

FESTIVE FUN DAY WITH DEVOTED 2 DACHSHUNDS RESCUE

A fun filled afternoon was shared on Saturday 25th November 2023 with the hard working members of D2DR, to assist with fund raising for their worthy charity.

The effects of the rising cost of living has meant an unprecedented number of dogs being relinquished to rescue groups around the country, as many people find their finances stretched to breaking point. Also the severe shortage of rental accommodation across Queensland means that many renters are either unable to find accommodation or are having to give up their pets in order to secure a rental property. All of these factors have put huge pressure on rescue groups such as D2DR, who find themselves at full capacity with the number of foster dachshunds in their care, many of whom require veterinary care of some sort.

Any little bit that we and our members can do as a club, or individually, is gratefully received. Attendance numbers were down on previous fun days, most likely due to the threat of rain, although the weather held out and a very enjoyable afternoon was had by all who attended.

HEALTH NEWS

Australian dachshund breeders can be very proud of their wonderful and positive reaction to the upcoming Dachshund IVDD Reduction Initiative (DIRI) which is backed by the University of Cambridge in England. Breeders in the USA, UK, Canada, Australia and New Zealand have registered to take part in the survey which will be looking at the impact of canine nutrition on IVDD, in particular to the brood bitch and puppies during gestation and beyond. The survey will continue for a period of 2 years after birth with spinal x-rays being taken of the dogs included in the survey, at 2 years of age, at the expense of the organisers. The following email was recently sent to those breeders that registered to take part:

"Thank you very much for noting your interest in the Dachshund IVDD Reduction Initiative to help improve the lives of dachshunds worldwide! We are pleased that we received responses from enough breeders to be able to move to the planning stage. We have, therefore, been working to develop the practicalities needed to launch the project.

You can expect another update in the next couple of weeks regarding formal onboarding for this historic trial which is set to start early in the new year. In the meantime, please follow the Facebook page or Twitter profile for extra updates. We will try to post regularly.
