VALE ATHALIE BEECHER 12/12/1931—3/2/2024



WHAT'S HAPPENING

CHAMPIONSHIP SHOWS — 8th and 9th JUNE 2024

Planning is well underway for our two Championship shows to be held on Saturday 8th and Sunday 9th June 2024. These will be held in conjunction with the Yuggera Club championship shows at Durack. This offers up a five show weekend opportunity—five possibilities of earning points towards that coveted championship status so look out for the schedule which will be posted on Show Manager in April. The judges for our two shows are Jorge Nallen and Adrian Landarte, both from Uruguay.

Saturday's show will be known as the Athalie Beecher Memorial Show and Sunday's show is our 60th Anniversary show, or Diamond Jubilee show.

This is held in conjunction with Devoted 2 Dachshunds Rescue (D2DR) and will be a Fun Day open to all dachshunds and their owners with a Halloween dress up theme. HEALTH NEWS

A further update has been received from the University of Cambridge who are managing the Dachshund IVDD Reduction Initiative (DIRI). Their update is as quoted below:-

"We wanted to give an update to illustrate what steps we must get through to make this study happen. There were questions we had to ask ourselves and the resulting viability checks we need to go through to make this study possible:

- 1. Are there enough dachshund breeders interested in helping advance science to curb the exceptionally high rate of IVDD/IVDC/IVDH in the breed? Yes! Your and other breeders' expressions of interest for this study proposal were fantastically encouraging. This high level of public interest for working on the reduction of dachshund spinal degeneration should therefore render achievable results much sooner than decades from now.
- 2. Are there veterinary specialists willing and able to donate their time and expertise to such a study? Yes! We're excited to have found specialists from three continents sympathetic to the cause of this worthwhile project to help with the study design, x-ray interpretations, and other important factors.
- 3. Is it possible to attain ethics approval for the study? It should be. Receiving ethics approval for a study involving animals is necessary to ensure the welfare of those animals in the study. We're starting on the paperwork for this.
- 4. Is it possible to have one manufacturer create a control diet (a typical food) and an intervention diet (the "special" food) for study participants in each country? It looks like it. Ideally we would want one manufacturer to create both diets and then ship them to all participants. We're working on the many details with the intent to finalize this soon.
- 5. Is it possible to have the exact supplements we need sourced so as to include them in the intervention diet? It looks like it. We're working on this as well.
- 6. Is it possible to set up a non-profit charity organization with a tax ID, a bank account, donation payment options, etc. for the study? Yes, and this step has been completed!
- 7. Other, more minor questions needing answers before we can begin."


NATIONAL DACHSHUND COUNCIL
